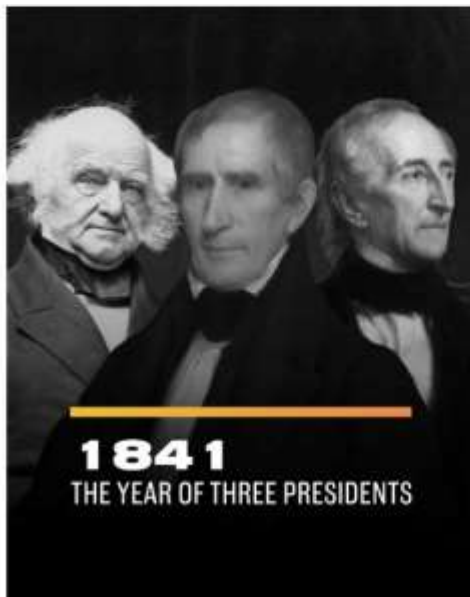

1841 THE YEAR OF THREE PRESIDENTS

In 1841, there were three men in the White House: Martin Van Buren, who left office; William Henry Harrison, who died shortly after taking office; and John Tyler, who had been Harrison's vice president.

Some of the major political events of this time will sound quite familiar to contemporary Americans, such as a disputed election, a last-minute Supreme Court appointment, and a party divided between different leaders. In addition to the parallels between 1841 and contemporary American politics, Professor Bolt will discuss how a major political party, the Whigs, went from the dominant political party in America to a party that found itself on the road to extinction.

As the nation reeled at the horror of the event, it was quickly forgotten when the terrible battle of Antietam began just one day later.

Filmed in cinematic 4K, Big Pacific breaks the boundaries between land and sea to present the Pacific Ocean in way never seen

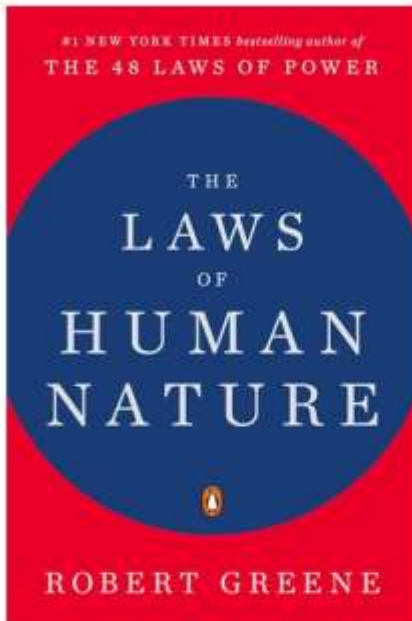

In this two-part talk, author Robert Greene, known for his seminal best-seller "The 48 Laws of Power," introduces the laws of human nature, examining why people behave the way they do.

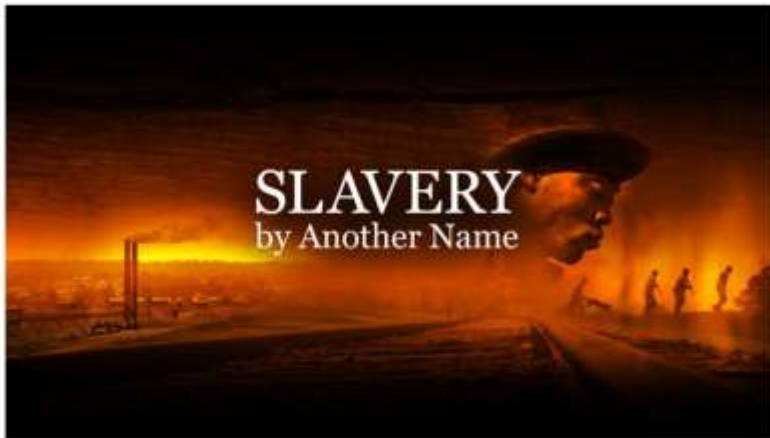

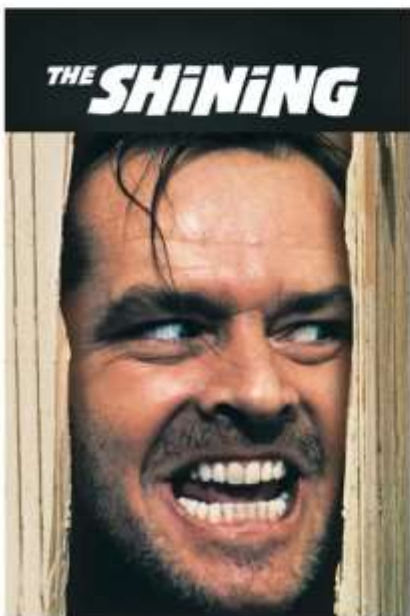

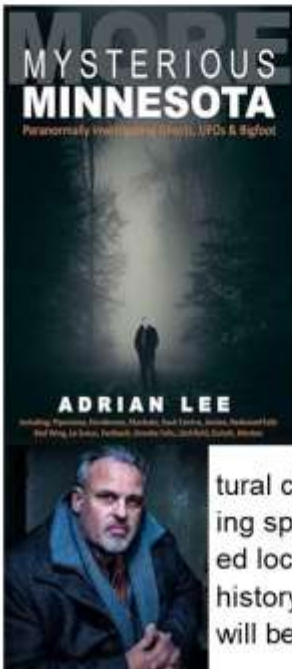
