### **7 INEXPLICABLE Mysteries of Humanity**

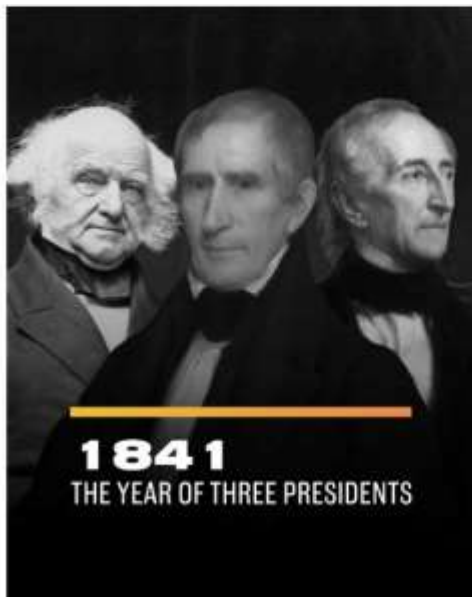
