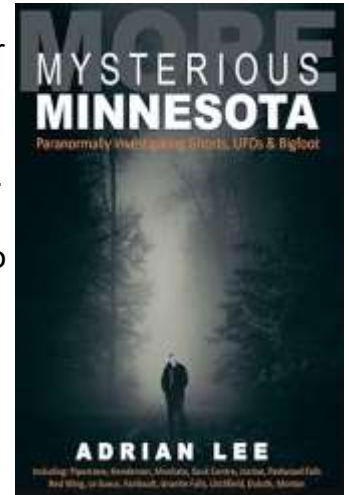
MOVIE MATINEES FOR SENIORS

In 1862 the Allegheny Arsenal, one of the nation's largest ammunition factories, exploded. Hundreds of young women perished in the flames, and it stands as the worst civilian disaster of the entire Civil War. As the nation reeled at the horror of the event, it was quickly forgotten when the terrible battle of Antietam began just one day later.

Filmed in cinematic 4K, Big Pacific breaks the boundaries between land and sea to present the Pacific Ocean in way never seen

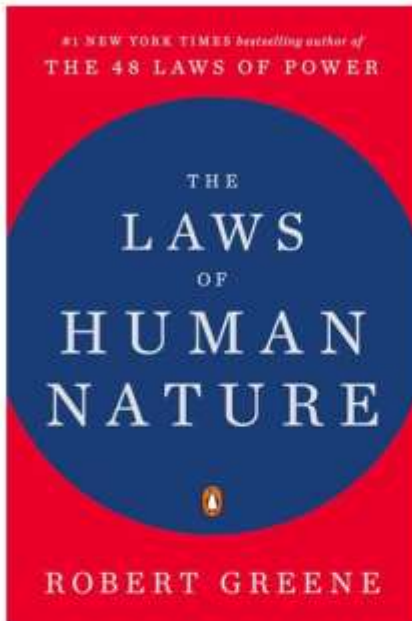

"Why Do People Do What They Do? The Laws of Human Nature" (Parts 1 &2)

In this two-part talk, author Robert Greene, known for his seminal best-seller "The 48 Laws of Power," introduces the laws of human nature, examining why people behave the way they do.

Based on his book "The Laws of Human Nature," Greene draws from history, psychology and power dynamics - explaining how emotions, ego and social forces shape actions and decisions in everyday life.

We are social animals. Our very lives depend on our relationships with people. "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade" (1989)

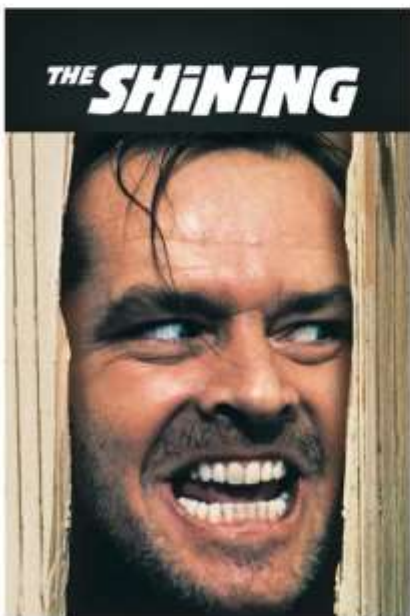

"On Trial for Murder: America's Most Famous Murder Trials: Leo Frank and the Mary Phagan Murder and Sacco and Vanzetti: Anarchists on Trial" (parts 3 and 4 of 10)
Thursday, June 11 at 2pm at the CAST Senior Center, Room 112



Leo Frank and the Mary Phagan Murder: Travel south to Atlanta, where in 1913 Jewish businessman Leo Frank went on trial for allegedly murdering a teenage girl in his factory. Complicating the narrative was an eyewitness who changed his story, as well as investigators plagued by confirmation bias, and Southern racial dynamics that made an honest trial all but impossible.



Sacco and Vanzetti: Anarchists on Trial: Do juries always get it right? Can public opinion sway the results? 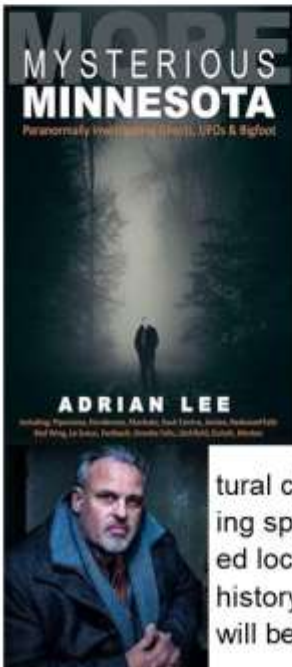
